An exceptional

region

Thanks to its relief and the diversity of its natural environments, the Cévennes d'Ardèche offers a host of majestic vantage points from which to contemplate the region. As the seasons go by, this precious land reveals treasures of colour it displays to the world like paintings.



The Tanargue massif is a prime example! Reaching an altitude of 1,500m, its name means «the mountain of thunder» in Celtic.


Every year in mid-June, around fifteen sheep farmers and their ewes climb to the summits of the Tanarque to enjoy the last collective summer pasture in Ardèche.



time to admire the flora and fauna from the vulture and landscape observation platform at Montselgues.

Further down on the plain, the enchanting Bois de Païolive overlooks the impressive Chassezac gorges. Walking around this karst plateau, covered in white oak forests, is like open-air caving.

This unique ensemble is an Espace Naturel Sensible (ENS - Sensitive Natural Area); in many respects, its biodiversity is remarkable. Well-marked footpaths and mountain bike trails take you through this mineral labyrinth in complete peace and



Its ridges, dominating the valleys and their steep slopes, are also a magnet for sports enthusiasts: paragliders, climbers, trail runners, mountain bikers, hikers...

You can take in the breathtaking scenery from the Col de Meyrand viewpoint, just above the village of Loubaresse, or take

4 viewpoints to feast your eyes on

The col de Meyrand at Loubaresse

The Col de Meyrand, on the Tanargue massif, is a gateway to the Ardèche mountains.

At Loubaresse, follow the D24 road for 2 km towards St-Etienne-de-Lugdares. An orientation table made from local chestnut wood stands by the roadside, on your right. From here, you can admire a wide panorama of the Beaume valley and village of Valgorge.

On a clear day, you can even see Mont Ventoux.

From Col de Meyrand, you can take the GR de Pays Tour du Tanargue hiking route (IGN map 2838 OT Largentière/La bastide-puylaurent), discover the church with the fortified tower of Loubaresse, take a break at the village bistro, admire the paragliders taking flight or climb the Coucoulude rock climbing site.



The orientation table at Banne castle

Set between sandstone and limestone, the village of Banne nestles at the bottom of the foothills of the Cévennes.

The oldest part of the village, Le Fort, is a tangle of cobbled streets and staircases leading under the arches of the houses to the ruins of the Château. From up there, the orientation table offers one of the most beautiful views of the southern Ardèche. It's an ideal place to take in the entire Bois de Païolive and the limestone lowlands as far as the eye can see. You can also see the Tanargue and the Alps in the distance.



From the Corniche path (4 km), which starts at the Estong car park in the Bois de Païolive, you can admire the magnificent Chassezac gorges.

Take care as the path is on a cliff face.



The Serre de Barre at Les Vans

The Serre de Barre is a mountain in the foothills of the Cévennes.

It rises to 909 m above the village of Naves and opens onto the superb meandering Chassezac river. It is also a superb take-off area for paragliders. From the summit, you can see the snow-capped Alps and Mont Ventoux to the east, Mont Lozère to the west, as well as the Tanargue massif and Monts d'Ardèche to the north. One massif follows another. The countless hamlets and villages scattered across the valley are a spectacular sight in themselves.

The watchtower, the highest point of the Serre de Barre, can be reached via a path from the D901 road which comes from Les Vans in the direction of Villefort (8 km). The car park is on the right, just after the hamlet of Les Combes. The path starts on the other side of the road, 50 m further up on the left. The yellow markings start at the sign «La Champ - Les plots». The path winds through chestnut trees before leading to a track you have to climb for 4 km to reach the Serre de Barre ridge.





Connect with nature

Art along the way on the Lauzes trail

Combining art and walking, the 14km Lauzes trail in St-Mélany invites visitors to admire contemporary works created in situ and to take a fresh look at the Cévennes landscapes.

Events, concerts, storytelling walks and theatrical performances are all part of this look at the Drobie valley.



Experience a «forest bath»

The bain de forêt is the French version of the Japanese term shinrin yoku (forest bath).

It's an ancient practice that brings us back to the present moment, connecting us to what surrounds us: opening our senses, taking time, contemplating, with the sole aim of feeling fully alive.

The vulture and landscape observation platform in Montselgues

Situated near the rendering area, this 100% local chestnut wood observation platform and telescope offer a unique opportunity to get up close and personal with the majestic vultures and the surrounding landscape.

Educational panels explain the inseparable link between farming and these great gliders.

Above the hamlet of Teste Rouge, follow the follow the signs to the platform about 500m away.

To make the most of the scenery on the Montselgues plateau and to ensure the vultures' peace and quiet, we recommend that you park in Montselgues and walk to the platform from the road.

Your head in the stars

Have you ever admired the sky on a summer's night? In Cévennes d'Ardèche, the celestial vault offers a fascinating spectacle.

There are preserved places, recognised for the exceptional quality of their night-time landscapes, labelled **International Dark Sky Reserves (RICE)**. There are only around twenty in the world, including 5 in France. With a total surface area of 3,560 km², the RICE of the Cévennes National Park is the largest in Europe.

The Monts d'Ardèche Regional Nature Park is currently applying for this label. The quality of the skies in our valleys is exceptional, as is the case of Saint-André-Lachamp, a commune awarded the 'Starry Towns and Villages' label by the Association Nationale pour la Protection du Ciel et de l'Environnement Nocturnes (National Association for the Protection of the Night

Sky and the Environment) and right in the centre of the core zone of the future Monts d'Ardèche International Dark Sky Reserve. From 2025, a programme of events focusing on astronomy and nocturnal biodiversity, free and open to all, will provide a better understanding of our incredible starry sky and why it should be preserved.

Enter the legend of the constellations

Let us guide you through a nighttime observation of the starry sky, punctuated by mythological tales from Greek legends. You'll learn to recognise stars and remarkable constellations.

A unique geological crossroad

There is a unique geological crossroads in the Cévennes d'Ardèche that has generated a great variety of different soils and an extraordinary diversity of landscapes in such a small area of land.

The identity of Cévennes d'Ardèche is built on this geological diversity.

Geosites UNESCO

Young volcanoes, waterfalls and basaltic organs, granite chaos, sites with dinosaur footprints... 61 geological sites of major interest, or 'geosites', make up the Monts d'Ardèche Geopark.



The Monts d'Ardèche Geopark is one of just 200 areas on five continents to have been awarded the Unesco label. By showcasing places where the history of the earth can be understood, visitors are invited to gain a better understanding of human history and the exceptionally varied land on which we live.

The Cirques de Naves

The Cirques de Naves geotrail leads you through superb, unspoilt landscapes, between the slopes of the Cévennes and the Mediterranean garrigue (heathland).

The circuit, which forms a 4km loop, passes through a limestone area compiling 18 million years of Earth's history. All this geological history, which has had a major impact on buildings, fauna, flora and agriculture, is explained at 11 stops equipped with interpretation tables.

The granite chaos at Montselgues

The chaos de Montselgues are granite chaos (landscape of rocky blocks), located to the north-east of the commune of Montselgues, in places called Serre de la Dame, Genest, Les Rancs and Le Petit-Paris.

Other natural attractions include three peat bogs on the Montselgues plateau. They are home to unique flora and fauna (carnivorous plants, dragonflies, butterflies, etc.) in stark contrast to the neighbouring mountain moorland.

The Vineyard trail at Rosières

If you're interested in wine, you'll find one of the local gems along the Vine Trail in Rosières – Chatus! The sandstone soil on the manmade terraces provides the ideal conditions for this typical Cévennes grape variety to flourish.

The Sentier des Vignes is a 6km Discovery Trail that's signposted and easily accessible if you park in front of the Wine Cooperative in Rosières.

The interpretation trail of the hamlet of Thines and its rock

The Rocher de Thines (Thines Rock), the last site to be designated and developed, is an extraordinary example of how the ancient Cévennes people used the riches of the earth to create the remarkable architecture of the church and village.

Comprising ten themed panels, the 2km trail (including the approach walk to the hamlet) guides you through the geological, architectural and historical wealth of the hamlet. You'll find unique archive photos, including a rare one taken by the legendary Robert Doisneau. To extend the experience, a booklet is on sale at the Maison du Gerboul and the tourist office.



Villages

& hamlets

A land of character and contrast. The Cévennes d'Ardèche are a multitude of small massifs carved into deep valleys that are home to picturesque villages bathed in light. Hamlets of limestone, sandstone, shale or granite reveal the history of our regions.



Villages of Character

Perched up high or hidden away, these «Villages de Caractère®» have that little something the others don't! Narrow streets, cobbled lanes and mysterious passageways add to the charm of these picturesque villages. There are 21 in total in the Ardèche department. From July to September, enjoy guided tours of «Banne, cité gourmande» and «Naves, de calades en fossiles».



Naves

Located in the foothills of the Cévennes and nestled in its olive covered hillsides, it is in a unique geological crossroads.

The old village of Naves will charm you with the many remains of houses from the Middle Ages or the Modern era: gable wall, mullioned window with or without chamfer...

From Les Vans, access the village of Naves on a short footpath (30-minute walk) marked in yellow starting from Rue du Bourdaric, on the corner of the bar, opposite the post office. After a few hundred metres, take the dirt road from Naves to the village. The return journey to Les Vans takes the same route.

Every Tuesday at 5.30pm from July to September, take part in the guided tour 'Naves, from calades to fossils'. Take an old mule track and discover Naves. Each alleyway is full of architectural surprises and geological wonders rich in fossils. Each rock has its own story. A unique opportunity to go back in time to the appearance of life on earth.

Banne

The personality of this village has been forged through its two districts.

The district around the church, whose pointed bell tower can be seen from the plain, echoes the so-called 'Fort' district, perched on a rocky peak, with an astonishing panorama.

A former medieval castle town, the remains of a late medieval castle can be found along a maze of narrow streets. Only the stables remain intact. Today, they are a prestigious venue for cultural events: shows, exhibitions and Bann'art, the Festival d'Art Singulier Around the fountain in the shade of the plane trees, you can't help but succumb to the timeless atmosphere of the village square, which hosts a craft and designer market every Monday evening in July and August.

Every Monday at 5pm from July to September, take part in the 'Banne, cité gourmande' tour. Let yourself be guided through a fortified village with a rich and eventful past, and enjoy a selection of products from local producers at the end of the tour!

Thines, jewel of the Cevennes

Getting to the village of Thines, recently classified as a UNESCO Geosite, is a journey in itself.

The access road is narrow and winding before giving way to the 600 m long Sentier des poètes. It's a journey you'll need to make to fully appreciate the beauty of this place. A true paradise on earth, where feelings of stress and time no longer exist. This typically Cévenol village, perched on a rocky promontory, dominates the entire valley of the same name. The Romanesque church is a jewel of the 12th century. Built in two-tone pink sandstone, it's a real

gem. Stop off at the Maison du Gerboul to sample some local produce.

For the more curious, a 10-panel interpretation trail guides you through the hamlet's geological, architectural and historical wealth. .

A tour of the village is offered every Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. by the «Friends of Thines».

Les Vans, at the convergence of the valleys

For a long time, the roads stopped here to make way for the mountain trails.

In addition to trading activity, there were also craftsmen. Buildings in the old center bear witness to this history, with a store or vaulted room on the first floor used as a workshop, office, stable or cellar.

Even today, the town of Les Vans is the urban center of an extensive rural catchment area. Lively all year round, it's a pleasure to stroll through its lively shopping streets. .

One museum, five exhibitions

Located on the edge of the old town center, the Musée des Vans is housed in the buildings of a former convent and silk spinning mill. Its collections of geology, archaeology, ethnography and medicine reveal the nature, culture and personalities of the people who have shaped this historic region.



Joyeuse, the medevial town

The remnants of the town's ramparts, its many narrow streets and vaulted passageways invite you to explore the town's rich past and architectural heritage.

Numerous artists and craftsmen have taken over the alleyways, inviting you to push open the doors of their workshops. .

Castanea - Ardèche chestnut discovery area

In the heart of the village, you can also visit Castanea - Espace de découverte de la châtaigne d'Ardèche. A museum space in a magnificent 17th-century building, where you can learn all about this emblematic local fruit.

Dramatized guided tours of the Duchy of Joyeuse

Our stones

have a history

From the dolmens of the plain, to the faïsses of the steep slopes, the landscape shaped by the hand of man accompanies you on all your escapades. From lanes to narrow streets, every step is a journey back in time.

Béalier

A shaped landscape

In the face of raw nature, the Cévennes farmer has resisted and adapted. He has turned a constraint into an asset. Over the generations, they have shaped these landscapes, making life on the slopes possible.

Small-scale agricultural heritage can be seen everywhere in the Cévennes d'Ardèche. For centuries, farmers have been shaping the landscape with numerous stone structures.

The pléjadou, which means «folding stone», is a large split stone used to bend long wooden rods for strapping barrels.

Terraces, or «accols» or «faïsses» in Occitan, are dry-stone walls that form terraces on slopes, retaining soil (while allowing water to pass through) to increase the space available for cultivation.

MOULIN à eau

The water mills at the bottom of the valleys are powered by a paddle wheel that drives a stone millstone, making olive oil or flour (cereals, chestnuts).

The limestone garrigues of the plain were the domain of shepherds, who built murettes, dry-stone enclosures, to guard their flocks, and capitelles, dry-stone cottages, for shelter.

The clède, also known as the chestnut drying room. Downstairs, a log fire is kept burning without flame. Upstairs, a spaced floor supports the chestnuts piled 50 cm high. After three to six weeks, they are finally dry.

Béalières (or béals) are small irrigation canals designed to collect and transport water from streams or rivers. The very gentle slope of the bealier allows optimum distribution of water through the canal.

Dolmens in Ardèche



An unsuspected treasure trove, 56 dolmens lie hidden in the limestone landscape of the Cévennes d'Ardèche.

They bear witness to a very ancient human presence dating from the end of the Neolithic to the Early Bronze Age (3,300 to 1,700 BC).

5 hiking trails and a lookout point allow you to discover the dolmens of southern Ardèche on your own.

The Chemins & Dolmens brochure is available free of charge from the tourist office.

Themed guided tours, exhibitions and workshops organized throughout the year offer captivating experiences on the theme of dolmens. Consult the agenda of the tourist office.



Grotte Chauvet 2, unique in the world

Enter the world's largest cave replica, Grotte Chauvet 2

The 3,500 m² facsimile is larger than life, and features ancient cave paintings over 36,000 years old.

To help you learn all you need to know on the subject, the site also offers a visit to the Aurignacian gallery, a fun museum space, as well as events for all ages during school vacations and weekends.

While you're here, take a detour to the Ardèche Gorges and admire the Pont d'Arc.

The templar commandery at Jalès

The Templar commandery at Jalès bears witness to the epic of the Crusades and the history of military orders, from the Knights Templar to the Knights of Malta.

Built in 1140, it is one of the oldest commanderies in Europe, and one of the very few Templar buildings where all the original buildings have been preserved...

Guided tours are available in July and August, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at 4pm and Wednesdays at 10am.

A family discovery game «Enquête à Jalès» (Investigation in Jalès) on the theme of the Templars is organized every Tuesday and Friday at 10am in July and August.

For music lovers, the Commanderie hosts the Music'à Jalès festival every summer. You'll love swinging under the stars in the large 18th century courtyard.





The Traversée Cévenole by electric bike (133 km, 3 stages)

Not far from the Trappist convent of Notre-Dame des Neiges, head for Montselgues and its granite chaos.

Through woods alternating between coniferous and chestnut trees, reach Les Vans. Between holm oaks, cades, vines and almond trees, here schist sets the tone. Then comes Malbosc, with its lauze roofs, steep slopes and man-made faïsses. Finally, the return journey takes the famous train Le Cévenol.



On water

The Chassezac

Its winding course stretches for almost 85 km, between canyons and rapids, pebble beaches and cliffs...

This mosaic of landforms and landscapes makes the river a paradise for nature-lovers: canyoning, canoeing, fishing, swimming, stand-up paddling and rafting. And why not try hiking on the many marked trails, mountain biking, via corda or rock climbina?



Free canoeing is only recommended on the sections indicated.

For the rest of the river, it is essential to be accompanied by a professional.

Canoë-Kayak

Fun and easy! Ideal for breaks, swimming or picnics! Three routes of 3 km (1h), 7 km (2h) or 10 km (3h).

Accompanied canoeing for 5-year-olds and over, or free rental for 7-year-olds and over. Introduction to canoeing on the lake from age 3.

Stand-Up Paddle

Accompanied descent lasting 3 hours, alternating between standing on the water and kneeling in the rapids. Also initiation on the water.

Rando-raft

If the river level is relatively high, enjoy a 2-hour guided tour.





Ecological pool: whitout chlorine, solar and wood heating...It also boasts a waterslide with four simultaneous starting points, a 25 meter long, 5 lane indoor lap pool, and indoor fun pool with hydro massage jets.

Bubble foutain and a slight current, a chlidren's indoor wading pool with a small rainbow slide ans a wellness space complete with sauna, hammam and jacuzzi.

Open all year.



Preserve our rivers!

Plunging into the depths of steep-sided valleys, crystalline rivers are veritable havens of peace, where nature expresses itself freely. The Drobie, Beaume, Thines, Ganière and Chassezac rivers are home to precious ecosystems.

6 easy eco-actions to help preserve our rivers



Watch your step

As far as possible, avoid trampling seagrass beds, which are a rich habitat for wildlife.



Silence is golden, enjoy the birdsong

Avoid being too loud and intrusive to disturb animals such as birds and beavers..



Pebble dams: a false good idea

We don't always realize it, but even small dams, by slowing the flow of water, heat up the water and have an impact on the river's flora and fauna. They also prevent the free movement of fish, which need to swim upstream to feed and reproduce. Moving stones can also alter the riverbed, destroying habitats and breeding grounds.



Choose your sunscreen carefully

Almost 1/3 of sunscreens applied to the body end up in river water, disrupting the metabolism of aquatic flora and fauna. We therefore recommend that you apply sunscreen at least 30 minutes before swimming, and that you choose sunscreens with natural, biodegradable ingredients. Even better: you can delay your exposure time or wear a T-shirt to protect yourself from UV rays.



Opt for zero waste

Use reusable objects for picnics (eco-cups, water bottles, cutlery, etc.). Take your garbage with you, and if possible, recover any nonrenewable waste you come across along the way.



Beware of fire!

Never build a fire, even if you're next to a river. Don't forget the pocket ashtray for smokers.

Did you know that 1 cigarette butt pollutes 500 liters of water?

PDO Châtaigne d'Ardèche

By consuming Châtaigne d'Ardèche PDO, you are supporting a global quality approach (product, method, environment, sustainable development, etc.).

The guarantees provided include the use of traditional Ardèche varieties with recognised taste qualities, full traceability and a ban on any chemical fertilisation or soil enrichment. Châtaigne d'Ardèche has typical aromas with discreet notes of brioche, bread pudding, pumpkin, sweet potato and honey. It has a distinctly sweet taste, sometimes accompanied by a slight bitterness.

In dried chestnuts and flour, there are also smells of dried fruit such as almonds and hazelnuts, and of cake.

Whether fresh, dried or in the form of flour, for these three products, all the manufacturing stages (production, processing, etc.) take place within the PDO geographical area, using traditional methods listed in a set of specifications.



Chatus, symbol of a resilient "terroir"!

A typical Ardèche grape variety, Chatus almost disappeared in the 19th century. Revived by a handful of winegrowers with a passion for the area, this unique red wine has today regained all its former glory.



PDO Picodon

In Provençal, «Picaoudou» means «little spicy cheese». It is made from whole, raw goat's milk.

The Picodon PDO is reserved for producers in Drôme and Ardèche, as well as the Valréas and Barjac cantons, who comply with a strict set of specifications.


